ow do you sum up the life of the great Luis Palau? He was one of a kind. A true servant of the Lord. A shining light in a dark world. He could win over the toughest crowd or the greatest skeptic with his wit and charm. He was a close friend to many, a trusted counselor to thousands, and a beloved teacher to millions.

To me, he was Dad.

It's hard to believe he's gone. Even though he passed away in March, I still find myself picking up the phone, thinking of calling or texting him to ask a question, or simply check-in. He was notoriously horrible at texting. His typos were many, and quite laughable. But he was consistent—always encouraging, supportive, and pointing others toward the Lord. It was almost always guaranteed you would get a Bible verse or word of wisdom in response. Either that, or a snarky response.

Dad was intentional, ever-present, and highly engaged.

As one of his four sons, I had a frontrow seat to his unique life. I saw him at his best and his worst. Having the honor and privilege of not only calling him my father but also my boss, I spent most of my life traveling the world with him, ministering and serving the Church together. I saw his highs and lows. His triumphs and struggles. His good days and bad days. And let me tell you, the man that many of you knew and loved was the true, authentic Luis. There was no show. No hiding.

Luis was the real deal.

I saw firsthand the way Dad interacted with individuals, no matter their background or beliefs. From society's elite...including presidents, diplomats, royalty, and business tycoons, to those not as highly esteemed...taxi drivers, maids, servers, and janitors. His sincere concern and care for each and every individual he encountered was palpable. It inspires and challenges me to this day.

I truly believe Dad had a far greater impact on this world than we will ever fully know this side of heaven. The sheer number of places he reached, barriers he demolished, and nations he influenced is astounding. And then there's the hundreds of thousands, if not millions of individuals who are in heaven today because of his invi-

LOVE FOR

THE MOST DEFINING MOMENT OF MY LIFE HAPPENED AT THE AGE OF 10, STANDING IN A LONDON SOCCER STADIUM. THAT WAS THE NIGHT I HEARD LUIS PALAU PREACH THE GOSPEL AND DECIDED I WAS GOING TO BE A WORSHIPPER

AND FOLLOWER OF JESUS CHRIST.

In a beautiful expression of God's kindness, my journey with Luis didn't end there. Around 15 years later, we met during a mission to the city of Manchester in the UK, where I was leading worship—and of course he preached the Good News of Jesus that day just as passionately as he had done all those years ago in London. Every time I had been around him since, it was the same story; Luis was a man who simply wouldn't stay silent about the beautiful news of salvation.

A few years ago, I had the privilege of leading worship in Times Square and Central Park at a mission to New York City, organized by the Palau Association. After leading some songs, it was an honor to introduce to the crowds the man who had brought me to faith. I felt the kindness of God in that moment—so aware of the wise and generous ways that He weaves together the details of our lives. Back in 1984, the night of my conversion, I love that God already saw this moment in NYC and smiled over it. As Luis started to preach, three decades on, I saw the same fire and passion I'd always seen—a man still enthralled with the love of Christ and overwhelmed to the core by the powerful grace of the Gospel.

Whether a stadium stage, a church pulpit, a factory floor, or a one-on-one conversation, you were always going to get the same Luis—a heart set on fire with the glory and grace of his God. That was the mark of this man.

I have heard it said, "Never meet your heroes," but in the case of Luis Palau, I'm glad I ignored that advice. He was not perfect—no one is—and both he and his loved ones would be keen to not see him elevated beyond what a man should be. But he was a warm-hearted, welcoming, and loving follower of Christ—who was more than eight decades into his life and yet still so very passionate about the kingdom of God.

For me, Luis exemplified what the late author Eugene Peterson called, "A long obedience in the same direction." When Christ gets hold of a man's heart and soul, there is an urgency to his ministry—and evangelists are not really the type to "retire." Yes, life can be rearranged and restructured to accommodate different seasons and our

aging years—but worshippers of Jesus Christ will always be worshippers—and a true evangelist will always stay an evangelist-right until the very end. That was Luis.

The Apostle Paul wrote:

"THOUGH OUTWARDLY WE **ARE WASTING AWAY, YET INWARDLY WE ARE BEING RENEWED DAY BY DAY."**

2 CORINTHIANS 4:16

In his final few years, at times battling both cancer and the effects of chemotherapy, a growing physical frailty was clearly evident in Luis' worn-down body. But inwardly, and in his spirit, it was a whole different story. Here was

a man fully alive. A good while after his cancer diagnosis, I remember going to hear him preach at a Spanish-speaking church in Anaheim, California. Yet again, I heard a preacher just as on fire for the Good News of Jesus as he was the first time I ever heard him. If anything at all had changed, there was an even greater urgency as he spoke about the eternal Christ, the promised glories of heaven, and the limited time we all have here on this earth.

As I reflect on the life and ministry of Luis Palau, it brings to mind the words of the Psalmist, found in Psalm 40:

"I have told the glad news of deliverance in the great congregation; behold, I have not restrained my lips, as you know, O Lord. I have not hidden your deliverance within my heart; I have spoken of your faithfulness and your salvation; I have not concealed your steadfast love and your faithfulness from the great congregation" (Psalm 40:9-10, ESV).

These words from Scripture are a very apt description of this Argentinian evangelist—a man who refused to conceal the love of God or restrain his lips in speaking forth the Gospel.

We worship a God of the "immeasurable" and some of the most profound things in ministry are the ones that simply cannot be measured. We can count crowds, radio listening figures, or how many books have been sold. We can perhaps even estimate the number of people who might have come to faith in Christ after hearing Luis preach somewhere around the world. All of these figures could be put on a spreadsheet or measured on a graph.

But when it comes to the true impact of the ministry entrusted to Luis and his family, it could never be measured. It is completely immeasurable. We can't fathom even the worth of saving one soul, let alone the multitudes who found new hope in Jesus through the faithful stewardship of Luis and his team. It is a wave of salvation that cannot be fathomed by our human flowcharts and won't fit into our statistical models.

I am so grateful to count myself as one tiny part of that immeasurable story—a young boy who journeyed from death to life having been presented with the Good News of Jesus Christ. I thank and honor my friend Luis for this—and give every ounce of glory and praise to the God who has become my salvation.

LOVE FOR THE LOCAL CHURCH

I WAS 30 YEARS OLD WHEN I MOVED TO PORTLAND, OREGON

TO PLANT A CHURCH. WIDE-EYED AND FULL OF EXCITEMENT, I HAD ALREADY DECIDED ON THE NAME OF THE CHURCH BEFORE I EVEN GOT TO PORTLAND. IMAGO DEI COMMUNITY. I HAD READ IT IN SOME THEOLOGY BOOK AND THOUGHT IT SOUNDED COOL.



It wasn't long before Luis had sought me out and was inviting me to lunch. I remember thinking to myself, "Man, I'm having lunch with *the* Luis Palau." It was pretty thrilling. Here I was, this young pastor, new to the city, and I was already spending time with this amazing world evangelist. It didn't take long for me to realize what was really going on. About 15 minutes in the lunch, it dawned on me. This wasn't an informal meeting between two new friends. It was a drill. An interview of sorts. He wanted to know who I was and what kind of church I was planting.

Because, frankly, Luis cared deeply for the local church and defended it to the core.

I think I passed the test that day. I answered, to the best of my ability, the theological questions he peppered at me, and convinced him, I believe, that I wasn't starting a cult. Overall, the conversation was going well. Then finally, toward the end of the meal, Luis asked, "Why didn't you give your church a proper name? What is this Imago Dei? I don't get it." I would hear that joke over and over and over throughout the years, every time we spoke together.

That was my first glimpse at how Luis loved the local church. He truly loved it. There's no question about it. What a lot of people don't know is that Luis never went into a city where the local churches didn't invite him. I can tell you firsthand, as a pastor, that the way Luis went about his work in various cities was so different. He didn't come into cities to do his own big thing or to push his own agenda. He went solely to serve the local church and to create a fire for evangelism within the heart of the church.

For several years, Luis and I traveled together. We visited cities and cast the vision for what a festival might do for their communities. I could speak to the long-term impact of a festival from a local pastor's perspective. He could cast the big vision. And let me tell you, those were some of the best trips of my life. As we would land in cities like San Francisco or New York, Luis would turn to me and say, "Listen, Rick. You be the heavy. You tell them that they need to quit being so insecure. Set aside their differences.

Start working together. I'll be the nice guy. You be mean."

And I would do it, because he was right! Sometimes, we are insecure pastors. Sometimes we do need a knock upside the head. But we also needed that loving hand. That father figure. Luis played that role so well—giving us hope, shaking us up, increasing our vision, and setting us on a new course.

Through Luis' ministry and the work over so many decades, he created an umbrella through which all of the churches through these local towns could come under and unite together for the Gospel. And it wasn't just thrilling. It was healing.

The word that comes to mind when I think of Luis is "integrity." There was never anything questionable about his motives, about who got credit, or about why he was there. That was

so clear to all of us, and in each one of those cities around the world, the local churches still continue to work together. That is a testimony to a man who loved the local church.

As I think about Luis' life, his love for the local church, and his love for me, as a pastor, I think of one thing. One tremendous gift.

He finished well.

We live in a day and age where most leaders, whether in ministry or otherwise, don't finish well. Yet for me...for my entire 20-plus year friendship with Luis...from the time he was 65 years old and on...I was able to watch my friend, my mentor, finish well. He ran to the tape. He ran through the tape. That very well could be the best gift he ever gave us as the Church.

He always did what he could to bless and encourage pastors and leaders.



love went far beyond family and friends. Presidents, dictators, taxi drivers, reporters, dentists, doctors, lawyers...even the random individual on the street...they all felt the same love and concern when they met Dad.


Dad was fearless when it came to strangers. He had no problem asking an individual he just met extremely deep, personal questions about their lives. And the amazing thing—most people didn't bat an eye. They seldom shrank away. Instead, his overwhelming sense of concern and love drew people in. Whether it was his infectious smile or unique accent, or just his demeanor in general, people knew he cared for them in a profound way. *And, of course, Dad always brought the conversation around to Jesus*.


As Dad began to decline, he ended up spending 15 days in the hospital. He had never

spent one night in the hospital in his entire life. Yet there he was, sequestered in the hospital for two weeks, hooked up to machines and stuck in his room. Because of COVID-19, only Mom was allowed to visit him on a daily basis.

As the family prayed and waited, we began to hear stories of Dad's impact in the hospital. One of Dad's doctors told me this story...

He and a nurse, who was also a believer, were walking by the nurse's station one night. As they passed, they saw a nurse crying. When they stopped to ask her what was wrong, she replied, "I just had the most amazing conversation with the patient in room 838 (Dad)." She didn't know who Luis Palau was, but she continued on, "He asked me all about my life and I found myself telling him everything about me. And then he said, 'I want you to come to Heaven with me."





Luis would do whatever it took to connect with others. And he really cared about people, especially his family. If ever there was a man living out the example of Christ, it was him."

That was Dad. Even writing that story brings a smile to my face. He wanted everyone to know Jesus and to go to Heaven when they died. And he seldom missed an opportunity to share the Good News.


Growing up in Argentina, Dad was deeply shaped by his own father's short life, who passed away when Dad was only ten years old. We heard the story all the time...how his father came to Christ, gave his life to the work of the Gospel, taught Dad (and all his family) to love the Scriptures and share the Truth boldly. How he helped plant churches throughout Argentina. And how he died with the full peace and assurance of heaven.

Not only his father, but his mother, my grandmother, deeply influenced his faith as well. Her confidence in God and love for the Word were foundational.

His younger sisters and brother looked up to him, and he supported and encouraged them in profound ways throughout their lives.

And then there's Mom. Dad was crazy in love with Pat. While they couldn't have been more different from each other, they fit together so perfectly. She was his partner in ministry. They kept each other grounded...and pushed each other closer toward Christ.


He loved us boys as well. It was the little things that showed how much he loved us...how

he wrote us notes from the road or how he made us get up early to study the Bible (which we didn't appreciate at the time). He challenged us to be men of God, to serve the Lord, and to love the Gospel.

I'll never forget the last words I shared with Dad. At this point, he was sleeping most of the time, but he briefly woke up as I held his hand. I hugged him tightly and patted that amazing silver white hair and whispered, "I love you so much. You were the best dad." And he replied, "I love you. I am so proud of you." We heard that all the time, there is nothing new about that, but still those words touched my heart. When he came down with cancer, every interaction with him contained some variation of those words.

He adored and loved his daughters-in-law very much—Michelle, Gloria, and Wendy. He'd call each one of them, every time we were on the road, just wanted them to know that he loved them and thought they were amazing wives and mothers.

His love ran deep for all of the grandkids as well. When he got out of the hospital and it was clear

he only had a few weeks left, his only priority was spending one-on-one time with each of his 12 grand-kids. He had a specific word written out for each of them...

"Be a Proverbs 3 man, David."

"You can be a choice servant of God, James." One by one, he poured out his heart and his love for his grandkids.

And the love he had reached farther than just his immediate family. He loved his church family, Cedar Mill Bible Church, where he and Mom and all of us worshipped for 60 years and counting. And he loved his partners in ministry, the staff at LPA, supporters, and prayer partners, past and present. He considered them his family, too. He always said—and I bet you could even quote it—"An evangelist without a team is nothing."

When Dad lost his father at such a young age, God became his Father in a very real sense. His peace, confidence, and boldness came from knowing he was fully loved by God and redeemed by His Son. My son Daniel put it this way, "When Jesus died on the cross and was resurrected from the dead, as the ultimate proof of God's love, the news went out into the world. Luis heard that same news almost 2,000 years later and got just as excited as if he were there when it happened. He shared the news with everyone he could, and they felt that same love of Jesus that he had experienced."

Dad loved us deeply because he was deeply loved. He loved everyone around the world like they were his own family, and he loved his family as if we were the whole world.



met Luis somewhere around the year 2015. At the time, my dad, Richard, was looking for ways to heal division in our hometown of Grand Rapids. A colleague urged him to connect with Luis Palau, and he reached out without a second thought.

My dad had known Luis for many years. They met through a mutual acquaintance and became fast friends over their shared passion for spreading the saving message of Jesus Christ. I only knew Luis by reputation, and what a reputation it was: He was a good man...a godly man...who preached the Gospel in word and deed. Yet when I first encountered him, I was blown away. His faith was even bigger than people said. He radiated humility and hope. From the start, I clearly saw that Luis was a man after God's own heart.

Luis shared my father's desire to bring people together, and in the days that followed, I worked closely with him to find the best path forward. As he always did, Luis showed the way. He took the vision of healing our city and elevated it to a place of deep spiritual healing. He casted vision for a city-wide festival where people of faith could unite in prayer, praise, and proclamation. He has led similar efforts in cities across the world, and he was excited to see how such a campaign could impact our city just the same. So we set out on the journey. And we're not talking

some blip, flash-in-the-pan event. For years, Luis and his team helped guide local volunteers and churches to make this vision a reality.

The final event in 2018 was extraordinary to behold. We ultimately brought together more than 430 churches from across Western Michigan. We gathered more than 30,000 people in the heart of downtown Grand Rapids. The Gospel was heard loud and clear and the spirit of God descended on that festival for two wondrous days. Nearly 2,000 people made the decision to follow Christ during that festival, and more than 220,000 people were touched by the Good News. Those two days made a profound difference in their lives, and in the life of the city itself.

Luis Palau led the way. And along the way, he personally strengthened my faith.

You see, my dad died only two days before the festival began. He didn't live to see the gathering he had worked so hard to create. I was heartbroken. But throughout the weekend, Luis spoke movingly about heaven and the happiness that waits for all who follow Christ. It was just what I needed to hear. In my hour of darkness, Luis Palau shined the light of hope. For that, for him, I will always be grateful.

Luis comforted me and my family in a time of great loss. And today, as we mourn his loss, we can all take comfort in the knowledge that Luis Palau has received his eternal reward. He is sharing in the joy of heaven, because he spread that joy during his time on earth.

Luis Palau was one of the finest leaders the Kingdom of God has known. What I saw in Grand Rapids is what millions more saw across the world. Just as no words could capture Luis' love of the Lord, no story could contain his limitless faith. Now that he's gone, those stories are pouring forth. Each one adds to the breadth and depth of the difference Luis Palau made. Even as we mourn his passing, it is only right to celebrate his lifetime of servant leadership in the name of Christ.

Luis worked in the vineyard his whole life. The fruits he bore have nourished and strengthened the faith of millions the world over. Not only that, he planted the seed of faith in so many hearts. Luis Palau may be gone, but his work and witness—along with the ongoing work of the team he established—will continue to bear fruit for generations to come.



INDWELLING LIFE OF CHRIST

I FEEL SO BLESSED TO HAVE KNOWN LUIS AND TO SEE, FIRSTHAND AND UP CLOSE,
HOW GOD WORKED THROUGH HIS LIFE AND MINISTRY. BUT WHAT WAS THE CENTRAL HEART
OF LUIS' MINISTRY? WHAT WAS THE DRIVING NATURE OF HIS EFFECTIVENESS?



The most remarkable aspect of Luis was that his sophistication flowed out of the simplicity of faith. "All of Christ in all of you," as Major Ian Thomas, a mentor of Luis, once said. "You can never have more. You need never have less."

Luis understood, at the core of his being, his holiness flowed out of the life and sacrifice of Christ. He understood better than most that the Gospel is not a ladder one climbs, but it's a cross one dies on daily.

Luis was a champion at keeping the main thing the main thing. And that wasn't easy in a place like Portland. The source of our power as the people of God is not our intellectual prowess, our backgrounds, our prestige, or anything that we would think would be the cause of success. No, Luis would be the first to say, "It is no longer I who lives but Christ who lives in me" (Galatians 2:20). It is the indwelling life of Christ in us that is the source of our power as God's people. That

conviction and that simple childlike faith is what purified Luis' life and, I believe, caused him to be a powerful conduit of God's grace for so many.

Luis, through God's wisdom, ensured that this ministry given by God would continue. Even through this past year, with a global pandemic forcing lockdowns and restrictions, nearly a million people came to Christ through the efforts of the Luis Palau Association. That's saying something. No matter the barrier, the roadblock, or the challenge, Luis pushed through. He proclaimed the truth. And his team continues on in the same way.

He would always stop, look you in the eyes with genuine love and concern, and share with you the simple, beautiful, loving Gospel of Jesus.

He loved people with a singular focus. He saw them as individuals, loved by Jesus.


Take me as an example. He looked at me...a hip young pastor with a gold front tooth, covered in tattoos, having a bit of a shady past...and he would introduce me, and I will miss this introduction for as long as I live,




We were friends. Good friends. And I know he deeply and truly cared for me. He never had a problem sharing the stage with me, dragging me around the world with him, setting me up to preach and share the Good News, to serve right alongside him.

I will miss Luis and his kind heart. I will miss seeing the fruit of Jesus pour out through each conversation and interaction he had. And I pray for each of us, that when we look back on Luis' life, we recognize a man who was all in for Jesus, who lived out those words he so often shared from Galatians 2:20, "I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me."

Luis had a gift for connecting with people all over the world no matter their age or where they came from.

WHEN WE FIRST GOT THE NEWS OF DAD'S DIAGNOSIS, IT ALL SEEMED SO SURREAL. THERE WAS AN INDICATION WE MIGHT NOT HAVE MUCH TIME LEFT WITH HIM, YET, BY GOD'S GRACE, WE WERE BLESSED TO HAVE THREE MORE YEARS. IT GAVE US TIME TO TALK, REMINISCE, PRAY, AND DREAM AS A FAMILY.

It allowed us to be intentional with our time and our words, although Dad was always good in that sense. But there was one topic that seemed to be off-limits. It was Dad's memorial service. It wasn't that he was afraid to die or think about that day. He just didn't care to waste time thinking about how he would be remembered. "Don't bother me with that," he would say if we tried to broach the topic. "If you decide to have a memorial service, that's on you. Don't drag me into it." There was a

bit of jest in his voice. It wasn't as if he was angry. But it was clearly not something he cared to waste time discussing.

After he passed, I found a note on his desk. If you knew Dad, you knew he had so many little notes everywhere—bullet points for a future sermon, verses to share with a grandkid or team members, notes about an upcoming festival, thoughts on a radio script, or questions for a friend. As I shuffled them around on his desk, I found one sitting right on top of them all. It was written to Colin James, one of our long-time, loyal, godly partners in the ministry. The note said: "Tell the boys, Colin, steer the memorial service to God's praise service. God-honoring, not Luis Palau's memorial service."

Then Dad wrote in quotes a hymn he particularly loved: "Praise my soul, King of Heaven."

And that was Dad. For Dad, to focus on Jesus was his way of life, to share Jesus with everyone, to show people Jesus everywhere he went.


Less about me. More about Him.

I know for a fact that this focus and desire came from his deep love for the lost. He wanted everyone to be able to know the peace, love, and joy that comes from knowing Jesus as their Lord and Savior. That same peace, love, and joy he experienced on a daily basis.

Dad always had a love for the lost. His sisters often reminisce of Dad as a young man. A teenager really. How often he would urge them to go, or drag them along, to to the poor areas of their neighborhood, bringing food and ministering to the children and sharing the Good News.

He cared little about most things. He often joked how golf was a waste of time. How





hobbies got in the way of ministry, and how vacations were such a bore. But sharing the Good News? That was life! And anyone who shared that same passion was a friend for life.

Dad built this ministry 40 years ago out of this passion for the lost. His vision and goal was clear—to reach as many people as possible with the Good News. To boldly share the hope of Christ

And that is what we will continue to do. In honor of Dad, but even more so, in honor of the Lord.

We will continue to stand strong for the Gospel. To proclaim it boldly. To unite the Church in this vision. To train up God's people for this mighty work. And to win as many to Jesus as possible. And we praise the Lord for

We will continue to raise up and encourage city leaders, encouraging unity, collaboration, and partnership in evangelism. And we will continue to inspire and equip a new generation of evangelists around the world.





So you're called to be an evangelist?" Those were the first words out of his mouth to me. "Don't wait," he said. "Use your gifts now. If God gives you 15 children to share with in a Sunday school class, then prepare and pray like it is 15,000. Be faithful with the small opportunities and God will open more."

Those words still ring true.

The year was 1994. I was a college student in Tulsa, Oklahoma, and had just started as a volunteer for Luis and his team as they worked on an evangelistic campaign in the city. The local director made a point to introduce me as a "young evangelist" to Luis. What I didn't expect was an impromptu 30-minute conversation filled with encouragement and practical insights.

I spent seven years working alongside that wonderful man, traveling with him, serving alongside him, and learning from him. He was a mentor, a friend, and a coach. And when God clearly was pushing me to step out and start my own evangelistic team, Luis was one of the first to personally support me financially. He offered office space within his ministry building. He called friends and encouraged them to invite me to preach. And he coached me through those challenging early years.

In total, I had 27 years with Luis. He was a godly leader and a true friend. I miss him dearly.

Luis always made time for younger evangelists like me. He knew the calling and the common struggles. He genuinely cared and wanted to see us succeed. That's just who he was, and who I long to be.

Not only did he care, Luis made concerted efforts to open doors for others like me. He would regularly reach out, through a phone call or text. He would recommend books, send me notes of encouragement, and push me to certain Bible passages that he thought pertained to my current circumstances. Maybe most moving of all, he simply made himself available.

I remember the first time I was set to preach before a president, during a European campaign. I was so nervous. Luis took my phone call the night before to pray and calm me down. It made all the difference in the world for me.

Luis was always thinking about the next generation. How could he bless them? How could he encourage them? How could he make life easier for them? It was a deep passion and concern of his, and you saw it in his actions. Just as Luis was blessed by the Billy Graham team in his early years of ministry, he wanted to bless others. In that spirit, Luis intentionally sought out hundreds of younger evangelists, bringing them into relationship with him and his team to learn and grow and challenge one another. He provided a place to learn the important "behind the scenes" skills to grow a ministry—support raising, team building, organizing outreaches, publicity, and more. He wanted to save each and

every one of us from the mistakes he made as a younger leader...to make life easier.

Luis built community for us as evangelists as well. He was honest about his frustrations, his shortcomings, and his disappointments. He told us of his joys and the blessings of sharing the Good News. He provided a forum for evangelists to meet together and learn from one another. One of the most beautiful things to watch today is how so many of us evangelists are now doing collaborative outreaches together. Many of us met because of time with Luis Palau.

I don't have words to fully describe all that Luis has meant to me. Some people leave a mark so deeply rich in your spirit that it's hard to see where the impact begins and ends. That is how I feel about Luis.

I'll never forget the day it all came full circle for me. It was in Luis' final days. He was battling cancer, and not doing very well phys-







ically. But he knew I had an outreach planned nearby. Nothing could keep him away. He was like a proud dad, wanting to watch his boy and help out however he could. He offered encouragement and support. He loaned me team members and equipment—whatever we needed. And best of all, on that warm summer evening in Portland, Luis took the stage. But this time he wasn't on stage to preach. No, this time he took the stage to introduce me...to set me up to share the Gospel. It was a surreal moment. In my early years with Luis, I was the one to introduce him. Now the tables were turned. The profound nature of the moment was not lost on any of us.

And so we continue on...sharing the Good News faithfully, just like Luis, and raising up the next generation, just like Luis.

LUIS PALAU:

ALIFE WELL LIVED

he outline of Luis' life can be simply told.

He was born in Argentina in 1934 and came to faith through the work of a missionary at the age of 12 and, from that moment on, felt compelled to share Jesus with others.

Encouraged with an initial grant of support by Billy Graham, he developed a ministry as an evangelist and by the

1970s began to have a distinctive global impact. In the decades that followed he crisscrossed the world, holding evangelistic events in 70 countries and preaching to literally countless numbers of people. Yet any evaluation of Luis' ministry must go beyond statistics to his significance. Although he moved to the United States and set up a base in Oregon, Luis remained distinctly Argentinian.

The appearance of a South American evangelist with a worldwide ministry proved that this sort of evangelical Christianity was truly a global phenomenon: the Gospel was not simply for all, it could be preached by all.

Let me share with you three things about the life of Luis that I celebrate.

First, there was Luis' energy. He was a man who, astonishingly, preached as an evangelist for nearly seventy years. In 2015, at the age of 81, he held an outdoor service for 60,000 people in New York's Central Park and lamented that planning laws hadn't allowed more attendees. Indeed, when he received news that he had lung cancer, one of his main regrets was that he might have to cancel some of his preaching events. In part, that energy came from his own natural strength but I'm sure a lot of it was asked of God and given by Him. Theodore Roosevelt once wrote, "Let us live in the harness, striving mightily; let us rather run the risk of wearing out than rusting out." There wasn't much rust on Luis.

Second, there was Luis' enthusiasm. One reason Luis was so good as an evangelist was he was so openly and wonderfully enthusiastic

about the Gospel. As anyone who heard Luis will testify, there was joy in what he said. With him the Good News sounded like good news!

Third, Luis was effective in his evangelism. It's not easy to assess the results of mass evangelism and whether commitments made in the heat of the moment have led to lives permanently changed for good and for God. Yet Luis' campaigns have had an unarguable record of producing people who 'went on with the Lord'. Indeed, there are many people serving in the British church today who made their commitment to faith in his campaigns here in the 1980s. Luis was gifted by God and he used that gift wisely to great effect.

Yes, I celebrate Luis' life. His was a life well lived and a race well run. He deserves that greatest of all epitaphs: 'he bore much fruit'. *May we do likewise.*

Luis taught me to love the Gospel. In fact, not only to love it, but to never move past it and to always share it.

You see, I was raised in a beautiful Christian home in Kingston, Jamaica. My father is a business man with the gifts of an evangelist. But those words, at the time of my marriage to Andrew, didn't mean anything to me. However, after these sweet years that we have spent together, traveling the world with Poppa and Momma what I called Luis and Pat—hearing him preach the same message over and over again with different illustrations, I've learned to love the cross and the Gospel message in a deep and beautiful way. Now I know exactly what all those words mean and I know the beauty of living these words out!

The word "evangelist" simply means "bearer of good news." You can be an evangelist for anything—for paper straws, for pet adoption, for beach clean-up, or any number of things. Luis was an evangelist for only one thing: the truth that God is good and that God has made a way for us to know Him intimately.

Luis taught me to love the Gospel. In fact, not only to love it, but to never move past it and to always share it.

I remember complaining to him once when Andrew was traveling. I was at home with two babies-finding it so difficult and lonely to be a mother alone with a traveling husband. I was wrestling with the lifestyle and lamenting

it—all of it—to Luis. He looked at me in all kindness and said, "Well, Miss Wendy, an evangelist can't just open the front door and preach to the sidewalk. He must go to where the people are."

When he shared that with me, something changed inside of me. Now I know. We go.

We go to where the people are.

The last thing Luis said to me was, "Miss Wendy, do big things. Dream great dreams. Don't ever give up on big events. Massive campaigns. Big events mean more people." And then he said, "Call Andrew over here. I want him to write a book about Heaven."

Even in his last days, when he could barely talk, he was telling us to dream big dreams, to reach as many people as possible, and to write a book about Heaven. He has always been our "big dream driver." How many churches? How big is the site? How many people can come? How many responses?

It's up to us now to grab the baton and run the race marked out for us...to persevere...to not give up. We don't have to be perfect, but we are called to be intentional. To run not for our own glory, but for the One who has done everything for us...the One who has given us all we need for life and godliness.

That's our calling here at the Palau Association. Just as Luis set out to accomplish so many years ago, our heart is to continue to stand strong for the Gospel, unite churches, proclaim the Good News, and impact cities worldwide. As long as we have breath, we will go, we will serve, and we will preach. And we will invite you to

join us every step of the way. For there is nothing greater than sharing the words of life with a lost and hopeless world.

Our world needs this message of hope more than ever.

Luis would never brag, but the truth is, he built—with the help of the Lord—a unique ministry. The powerful work we do at a local level has deep, lasting impact to change culture and lives. The festivals we accomplish shake cities and proclaim the Good News widely. The digital evangelism, radio, and television efforts help saturate the world like little else. And the empowering work—for individuals, younger evangelists, city leaders—helps multiply our efforts in tremendous ways.

I'm proud to be part of this story. I'm proud to help continue Luis' legacy and Kingdom work. And I'm excited for the days ahead—working hand-in-hand with friends like you.
